In determining how to use potential ARP funds for the Anthony Northside neighborhood association, active members generated some ideas at a meeting in summer of 2022. The association decided to create a survey with ranking options for proposed ideas as well as a blank space for additional ARP fund project ideas. The survey was added to the ANNA website, and a notification on the association Facebook page was also posted in September 2022, with hard copy surveys distributed in door to door canvassing in September. A deadline of late October (28th) was created for completion of the survey. Results were reviewed in the December 2022 meeting with ranking as follows. were: 1) Dog Park / Community Garden / Park, 2)


Beautification / Mural Art, 3) Flashing Pedestrian Lights at Bethel / New York, 4) Blight Removal for Community Space, 5) Additional Neighborhood Entrance Signage, 6) Block Party/Celebration, 7) Website Dedicated to Code Violations. After much discussion over the next few months, the association determined the following projects from the list could be realistically completed within our allotted funds.

Describe the scope of the projects, including estimated timeline.


1. Project One: "Little Free Library" allocated cost \$1000.00 - summer/fall 2024

Little free library would be installed on the corner of Belmont and Winston Drive. It would provide the opportunity for children of all ages to borrow or exchange books to help promote literacy in our community. Indicators will be books missing from the library and different books in the library.

0. Project Two: "Additional neighborhood signs" allocated cost \$4200.00 - completion dependent on city of Muncie

The neighborhood will work with the city to purchase two additional neighborhood signs. These signs are similar to ones purchased a few years ago. They will go along Bethel and Oakwood to indicate more boundaries of the neighborhood. Since we must purchase the signs through the city, we cannot obtain two quotes.

0. Project Three: Neighborhood mural allocated cost \$12,000 - summer/fall 2024

The neighborhood will work with Muncie Arts Council to secure an artist for a proposed mural. Proposed fair market cost is \$22/square foot of space. The association feels that \$12,000.00 would be sufficient. Indicators will be improved beauty in the neighborhood near the intersection of Centennial and Wheeling.

0. **Project Four: Stone bench allocated cost of \$7000.00 - summer 2025, dependent on contractor**

The neighborhood association will have a stone bench built near the restored pillars in a similar style as the pillars. The bench will contain a compartment for a time capsule as well. The association will work with the city on the exact location along Wheeling. Indicators will be people using the stone bench for sitting or waiting for the MITS bus or as a photo opp with the restored pillars.



0. **Project Five: Time Capsule for stone bench allocated cost of \$1200.00 -upon completion of stone bench.** The neighborhood will purchase a time capsule for the stone bench project on Wheeling and Cowing. Indicators preserving the memories of restoring the stone pillars for future generations.

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Project 6: Park bench for new park in neighborhood allocated cost of **\$1500.00 - upon completion of the park, at the end of 2026 or sooner** The association will purchase a park bench with signage to remind people

of the association. Indicators will be a hopeful increase in association meeting attendance. These quotes are from the mayor.



Project 7: Community Engagement Event allocated cost of \$1000.00 - spring/summer/fall of 2025 or 2026

The Association would plan and implement an engagement event in order to bring people in the neighborhood together. Items such as food trucks, bounce houses, and activities/games will be purchased or rented. The timeline of this event and logistics has yet to be determined, but will be completed before the end of 2026. Indicators include event attendance and engagement.

Project 8: Park improvements for the future park added into the neighborhood allocated cost remaining funds, currently \$32,485.96 - dependent on parks department and vendors, by the end of 2026 Association will work with the mayor and city for park improvements. Improvements may include landscaping or additional park equipment as determined by the neighborhood and mayor.

Describe how the ARP funding will impact the neighborhood association.

1. A little free library will provide residents the opportunity to build literacy skills in order to increase quality of life for the next generation of the Muncie community 2. Additional signs indicating the Anthony Northside neighborhood can instill neighborhood awareness and pride. 3. The mural will add vibrant art to a drab

area of the neighborhood. 4. The stone bench will provide seating as people walk along wheeling or wait for the city bus. 5. The time capsule will bring the neighborhood members together as they determine exactly what to put in the capsule. It may become part of the community engagement event as well. 6. A park bench with the association information will communicate with people about the monthly meetings in order to offer a regular opportunity to engage with the association. 7. A community event is for outreach to help residents check out what the neighborhood and association have to offer on a regular basis. Food options will act as an incentive. 8. The addition of a neighborhood park with improvements to better the park will enhance the attractiveness of the neighborhood to families wishing to purchase homes in the neighborhood. It will also build community pride and provide a place for children to play within walking distance of homes in the neighborhood.
